Psychotropic Drug Use

The Scotland Board of Education prohibits all school personnel from recommending the use of psychotropic drugs for any student enrolled within the school system. For purposes of this policy, the term “recommend” shall mean to directly or indirectly suggest that a child use psychotropic drugs.

Psychotropic drugs are defined as prescription medications for behavioral or social-emotional concerns, such as attentional deficits, impulsivity, anxiety, depression, and thought disorders and includes, but is not limited to stimulant medications and anti-depressants.

However, school health or mental health personnel, including the school nurse or nurse practitioner, the district’s Medical Advisor, school psychologist, school social worker, and school counselor may recommend that a student be evaluated by an appropriate medical practitioner.

Communications between and among school health, mental health personnel and other school personnel pertaining to a child in possible need of a recommendation for a medical evaluation shall be accomplished through the district’s established child study team and/or the planning and placement team and its procedures, in conformity with state and federal special education statutes.
